

1. PURPOSE

This policy explains how courses can be double-counted when a student elects to fulfill two majors, or between a major and a minor.

2. WHO IS AFFECTED BY THIS POLICY

Undergraduate students.

3. POLICY STATEMENT

Students may elect to graduate with two majors. In such instances, students must fulfill the requirements for each of the majors. In satisfying the requirements of two majors, some courses may be found to be applicable to both. Such courses (including cross-listed offerings) may be counted towards each major, but not beyond a maximum permitted overlap of 5 (four-credit) courses. For students completing the requirements of a double major, courses fulfilling the requirements of one of the majors can also be accepted as satisfying the Comparing Worlds or Mapping the World requirements unless both of the majors require the same course. When both majors require the same course, this course cannot also be counted towards General Education.

Courses taken to satisfy requirements for a minor must include at least three courses which are not being applied towards a major or another minor. Courses taken to satisfy the General Education requirements, including FirstBridge courses, may be applied towards a minor.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES

The Office of the Registrar is responsible for assuring that the limit for double-counting courses is not exceeded when the student applies for graduation.
