#### CREDITS REQUIRED FOR GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Tuition and fees vary among the different graduate programs due to the length of study, trips, and international residencies. To try to understand the full cost of living and tuition look in the table below and click on the link. For information about tuition and fees only, please scroll down.

#### TUITION

Tuition includes the cost of student activities, academic support services, and housing services and is charged on a per credit basis. Tuition for 2019-20 is €810 per credit and must be paid in full before classes begin; all payments must be made in euros.

In the fall and spring graduate students generally take 16 or 18 credits a semester. Tuition and fees for 2019-20 can be calculated as follows:

12,960 € Tuition for 16 credits: 810 x 16  
 14,580 € Tuition for 18 credits: 810 x 18  
 500 € Health fees for each semester  
 460 € Orientation fee charged only in a student's first semester at AUP  
 250 € Optional housing during orientation

Tuition in the summer is also based on the number of credits taken\*\*:

1,620 € 2 credits  
 3,240 € 4 credits  
 4,860 € 6 credits  
 6,480 € 8 credits

\*\* Students in the Diplomacy and International Law program are charged an additional fee of 1,500€ to cover the costs of the University of Oxford-George Washington Law School International Human Rights Law Summer Programme.

Students with a course load of 12 credits in the fall and spring and above are considered full time; those with a course load of 11 credits or fewer are considered part time. Full time students may audit one additional course at no charge in the fall and spring.

#### REQUIRED FEES

Required fees include an application fee, health insurance and, for incoming students, an orientation fee.

#### NON-REFUNDABLE TUITION DEPOSIT

The €750 non-refundable tuition deposit paid by all students when confirming attendance is credited towards the first semester's tuition.

#### ORIENTATION FEE

The orientation fee covers all activities that occur during the orientation program of a student's first semester, including workshops, cultural activities, and materials.

For those who need temporary accommodation during orientation, the fee is €710.

For those who do not need temporary accommodation during orientation, the fee is €460.

Please note that orientation is mandatory and that the orientation fee will not be waived even when a student does not attend orientation.

#### HEALTH INSURANCE FEE

The health insurance fee for 2019-20 is €500 per semester. For additional information please consult the [Health Care Plan](#).

#### ADDITIONAL FEES

##### LATE PAYMENT FEE

A €250 late payment fee is charged for any tuition received after the published payment deadlines.

##### AUDITOR FEE

Auditors pay 50% of the per-credit basis. As tuition for 2019-20 is €810 per credit, the auditor rate for graduate courses is €405 per credit. Auditing a 4-credit course will cost 1,620€. Students with a course load of 12 credits and above may audit one additional course at no charge in the fall and spring.

#### PAYMENT PLAN OPTIONS

The American University of Paris is sensitive to the financial pressure that may arise over the payment of each semester's tuition. As a result, the University has developed two payment plans to meet different students' needs. These options are available only to full-time students.

##### SEMESTER PAYMENT PLAN

Students must pay in full prior to the start of each semester. The following payment deadlines pertain to each semester:

Fall - 15 July

Spring - 15 December

Students who do not pay for the entire semester's tuition prior to the deadline are charged a €250 late payment fee and need to contact the Student Accounting Services Office. Note that all American citizens borrowing U.S. federal loans are automatically on a semester payment plan. [Learn more about U.S. loans](#) at AUP.

##### INSTALLMENT PLAN

Full-time students may apply to pay on the installment plan. This plan consists of four installments for either fall or spring semester, due in full before the beginning of the semester. There is no installment plan option for summer.

Tuition and fees are due in full prior to the start of a semester. A service fee of €200 is charged for each semester the installment plan is selected.
