Project Summary: Buying condoms for AUP students

Explain How Your Project Will Benefit the AUP Community:

According to the Center for Disease Control, 1 in 2 sexually active persons will contract an STD by the time they're 25 (1). The key to curbing the STD epidemic lies in prevention rather than treatment. Therefore, it is pertinent that young adults have easy and free access to safer sex materials. This is especially important for young expats in a foreign country, where navigating a new healthcare system in a language they don't know can be especially daunting.

Over the past few years the GenSeX club has given away more than 1,000 condoms to AUP students, however we have now run out of our original donation. Therefore, we are making a request to buy more condoms in bulk for us to give away. Ensuring the safety, health, and well-being of our students also ensures a more comfortable environment for our university.

However handing out just condoms does not encompass all we can do to aid our students with their health. We want to broaden our horizons in terms of our resource distribution to include internal (female) condoms, a wide selection of condoms, dental dams, as well as packets of lubricant. Internal condoms are latex free for our students with latex allergies. Providing a few different types of condoms to choose from will increase the chances of a student utilizing this resource. Dental dams protect the transmission and contraction of STDs during oral sex, as well as ease those suffering from chronic pain conditions or sexual dysfunctions. One of the leading causes for condoms to break is because of friction, which can be solved with additional lubrication (2).

As condoms don't expire for several years, whatever we don't distribute this semester can surely be passed on to future ones.
